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# PREFACE.

He experience of Saints, if it should speak what it . harh found, it would with an united voice yield anabundant teltimony of the manifold uses of the. Pfalmes. It would fay that they have in them Inftiuctions to increase knowledge; Spirituall fervour to inflame zeal : Confolation to refresh and revive fainting fouls; Petitions to fetch bleffings from God; Prilifes, as thankfull returns to God for his bleffings : Yea. it bath found in them, that afflictions themselves do yield confolations; because though deep afflictions overwhelm excellent Saints, yet even then they are Saints amid such afflictions. It findes yet farther, that afflictions of Stints generally end in confolations; the fame Pfalm beginning (as Jonahs prayer) in the belly of Hell, yet ending in Heaven. For the fouls of the Saints being stirred up by sharp afflictions to be earnest with God in (mournfull, yet melodious) supplications, God thus earnestly invoked, turns in unto the foul, and his prefence makes a Heaven even where a Hell was before. And then according to the benefit arifeth the thankigiving; and the foul mounts up to a height of praises, as it felf was mounted up from the depth of gilef, to a height of deliverance, joy, and confolation. Briefly, experience will fay, That the Pfalms are Characters and representations of the thoughts; medications, and affections of a fanctified foul, throughour all the changes of her pilgrimage; fo that a good man can be in no kinde of eftate, but he shall finde his own estate in a Plalm, and withall finde thoughts and expressions fire table to that estate, which may improve and make it good unto him.

But to give some account of this version; That which hath been especially aimed at and endeavoured in it. was that the Holy Ghoff might speak his own sense and as neer as may be in his own words. To this end the whole hath been conferred carefully with the originall. which hath been firitly followed, and the last translation in concurrence with it, from which few places have been altered, except where some very probable cause hath appeared.

The name Jehovah hath been fometimes retained. and the names God and Lord have been interchangeably used, but not without a pattern given by the Holy Ghoft. For the same verse being repeated in Pfal. 63. 6. which was before in Pfal. 14.7. in one of them we reade. The Lord bringeth back, and in the other, God bringeth back. Epithets are feldome added, except fuch as the original word doth justifie and carry in it and if any other, they are fuch as common reason at first fight may approve, or (which is more) the Scripture it felf dothule in other places. But poeticall painting hath been mainly avoyded, as caffing lightnesse upon the divine gravity of those spiritual Songs, whose vertue communicates it felf most not by the enticing words of mans wildome, but by demonstration of the Spirit. Likewife though fome clegant and more refined words have been at hand, yet they have been omitted in favour to the common capacities, whole edification may not be neglected, it being a duty of more mercy and charity to

profit many, then to please a few. Yet on the other fide, a rude and coorfe handling hash been avoyded, care being taken for a smooth currencea

leneles, to being outwardly fitted to measures, and by reace, and fit eadence, though the fittable cadence be measures to finging, the finging carries a delight with it, that which in case of necessity may (and perchance somethe delight invites to a more frequent ule, & the frequent time doth) fuffer fomething it felf, and lofe a little, use increaseth the profit of them. Yea, the same delight that the sense, which is of more importance, may gain

If every particular piece come not up to the defires of all (which perchance is impossible)all may yet know, that there wanted not care and labour, even where there may be some other wants. And if any shall be pleased to make triall, they may possibly finde that the fault which is eafily found, is not eafily amended.

Some flort verfes being between two long ones, sometimes have a larger Paraphrale, that parts of two diverte verses be not joyned together in the midft of one line, and fo make up one line of two diverse matters. Sometimes also to avoid the same inconvenience, there must be a contraction of verfes, otherwife large, which are thereby fomewhat the more throng'd, and prest together, yet with fuch fmoothnesse as that pressing would admit.

As for the measures, they are fitted to such tunes as have been found by experience to be of most generall use, for it was not thought reasonable to put any Psalm by a hard tune out of the use of any Congregation, For that were to put the lofte of fuch a Pfalm upon that Congregation. True it is, that in a former Edition Plalms have been fee forth in measures fitted for more difficult tunes, which are still to be feen: But it was objected by very good judgements, that if fuch difficult tunes. were allowed, fome man willing to make use (if nor (how) of his skill might begin a Pfalm in a tune wherein the Congregation might be put to a loffe. For they might either not follow him at all, or follow him in a discord, in stead of a harmony. And indeed it is very futable to charity, that those that have skill should condescend to them that have none, and not by that skill hinder edification of the unskilfull.

As for any inconvenience which may be supposed to fall out at first, by bringing Pfalms into use hitherto not afed, and whereof the copies are not yet common, that

A Preface. is prevented by the Directory, where it is recommended. that in the Congregation the Plalm be read line by line before it be fung.

And now let this Prayer be our conclusion, That the glory of God, by the more lightfome, cheerfull, and spirituall singing of Plalms, jointly with the edification of the finger, may be advanced; and withall that those Pfalms which in this place of warfare and pilgrimage have in them some mixtures of complaints and tears, may to him that spiritually useth them, be foregoers of those heavenly Songs and Hallelujahs, which shall be sung in that Consort which is above, by a joynt Quire of Angels and glorified Saints; where all tears 3 He shall be like unto a tree, shall be wip't away, and where fongs shall have nothing in them but matter of joy to him that fings them, and of glory, honour, and praise to him to whom they are sung; where by continual returns, joy shall arise from praise, and praise from joy unto all eternity.
